DIGGING DEEPER

- 1. Take some time to read Luke 15.

- 4. How would you respond if someone asked you what the "mission" of a Christ follower is? Whatever definition you come up with how are you doing fulfilling that mission? Where do you struggle?
- 5. How do you think "Christians" are doing at loving those outside the church?
- 6. In what ways/areas/issues do you think the "Church" might be tempted to exclude people? Have you ever felt excluded by Christians or the "Church"? How do we push back against the drift or tendency to exclude people?
- 7. How do you think South Park Church should measure success as a faith community?
