SERMON NOTES

God's Purposes Prevail - Acts 7:48 - 8:4

Acts 7:48-8:4

48 "However, the Most High does not live in houses made by human hands. As the prophet says:

49 "Heaven is my throne, and the earth is my footstool. What kind of house will you build for me? says the Lord.

Or where will my resting place be? 50 Has not my hand made all these things?'

51 "You stiff-necked people! Your hearts and ears are still uncircumcised. You are just like your ancestors: You always resist the Holy Spirit! 52 Was there ever a prophet your ancestors did not persecute? They even killed those who predicted the coming of the Righteous One. And now you have betrayed and murdered him— 53 you who have received the law that was given through angels but have not obeyed it."

54 When the members of the Sanhedrin heard this, they were furious and gnashed their teeth at him. 55 But Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. 56 "Look," he said, "I see heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God."

57 At this they covered their ears and, yelling at the top of their voices, they all rushed at him, 58 dragged him out of the city and began to stone him. Meanwhile, the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul.


59 While they were stoning him, Stephen prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." 60 Then he fell on his knees and cried out, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he fell asleep.

8 And Saul approved of their killing him.

On that day a great persecution broke out against the church in Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout Judea and Samaria. 2 Godly men buried Stephen and mourned deeply for him. 3 But Saul began to destroy the church. Going from house to house, he dragged off both men and women and put them in prison.

4 Those who had been scattered preached the word wherever they went.

DIGGING DEEPER

- 1. What do we learn about Stephen before he addresses the Sanhedrin (Acts 6:1-15)? Who do you know who has has similar qualities?
- 2. Read Acts 7:1-50. What stands out to you about Stephen's summary of the story of God?
- 3. "Would you say the Old Testament is more like a stranger or a close friend to you? What will you do to let its importance grow for you?"*
- 4. Read Acts 7:51-8:4. What did the Sanhedrin hope to accomplish by stoning Stephen? What was the result? What did God accomplish?
- 5. How could people who had the same knowledge of the biblical history that Stephen did have such a radically different reaction to its current application?
- 6. How does the pattern of transformation apply in your life and our church in this season?
- *This question comes from the Serendipity Bible. This amazing resource contains inductive study questions for every chapter of the Bible plus many topical studies. It's a great tool for every small group leader as well as personal study.
