1. God's ways are infinitely higher than our ways

• As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts. Isa. 55:9

2. God gave us Scripture to teach, guide and inspire us

 All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work. 2 Tim 3:16-17

3. God wants to be known by us

• Thus says the LORD: "Let not the wise man boast in his wisdom, let not the mighty man boast in his might, let not the rich man boast in his riches, but let him who boasts boast in this, that he understands and knows me, that I am the LORD who practices steadfast love, justice, and righteousness in the earth. For in these things I delight, declares the LORD." Jer. 9:23-24

Basic Fact Summary:

- Job is blameless
- Job is prosperous (wealth, family, health)
- Satan credits Job's prosperity with his obedience and faithfulness to God
- God allows Satan to destroy Job's wealth & family and finally his physical health
- Job remains faithful to God despite horrific adversity
- Job is visited by 3 friends who blame his tragedy on his sinful behavior and urge his repentance
- Job knows he is blameless and pleads with God for justice
- A 4th man, Elihu, enters the scene and reprimands Job's 3 friends and Job
- God then directly reprimands Job's 3 friends and chastises Job
- Job repents for his lack of understanding
- God then provides Job with twice his original wealth and another 10 children

Premise of Job's 3 friends:

- A. God is in control of everything
- B. God is just
- C. God has allowed Job to suffer
 - -- therefore --
- D. Job must have sinned

Job's Friends' Belief: Suffering is Evidence of God's Punishment

The friends' conclusion is false:

We know that Job did not sin, he did not cause his own suffering:

Then the LORD said to Satan, "Have you considered my servant Job?
 There is no one on earth like him; he is blameless and upright, a man who fears God and shuns evil." Job 1:8

 After the LORD had said these things to Job, he said to Eliphaz the Temanite, "I am angry with you and your two friends, because you have not spoken the truth about me, as my servant Job has. 
