THE PERFECT MODEL: CHRIST

- Ecclesiastes focuses us on God at all times and in all circumstances
- Jesus provides the model of a perfect life for us to follow
- Our goal: strive to become more Christ-like



WARNING

- It is a lifelong pursuit
- In this life it is an impossible standard
- Do not be discouraged: read Acts 1-7 for how the Holy Spirit totally changed and empowered the disciples
 - From fearful to courageous
 - From confused to insightful and focused
 - From limited language skills to speaking forcefully in many languages

PRAY

- Jesus regularly spent private time praying to the Father and communing with Him
 - Luke 5:16: He would often slip away to the wilderness to pray
 - Matt. 14:23: He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray and when it was evening He was there alone

PRAY-continued

- Luke 6:12--He went to the mountain to pray and spent the night in prayer
- Mark 1:35--Before dawn He went to a secluded place to pray



OUR PRAYER GOALS

- Pray at any point during the day -- 1 Thess.5:18 -- "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances"
- Pray for God to empower us and guide us
- Don't just recite words
- Quiet times are desirable when feasible
- The Lord's Prayer--focus first on God, then on us, then back to God

TURN TO GOD IN OUR TIMES OF GREATEST NEED

- Jesus turned to the Father in the Garden of Gethsemane
 - --"My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet not as I will but as You will" (Matt.26:39,42 and 44)
- And on the Cross
 - Father forgive them (Luke 23)
 - Why have You forsaken Me (Matt. 27 and Mark 15)
 - Into Your hands I commend My spirit (Luke 23)

PRAY

In the garden



IN OUR TIMES OF GREATEST NEED...

- Pray earnestly
- Pray that God's will prevails
- Know that God's plan may not be apparent to us
- Ask others to pray for you
- Head to God, not away

HUMILITY

- Jesus exhibited the ultimate in humility by leaving His heavenly throne, coming to earth as a lowly baby, ministering to us and dying on the Cross for our sins
 - Philippians 2: 5-11--"Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God,did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made Himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man,

HUMILITY

- Philippians 2:5-11--continued
 - ... "He humbled Himself and became obedient to death--even death on a cross! Therefore God has highly exalted Him to the highest place and gave Him a name that is above every name; that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in Heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord..."
- OUR GOAL: Pray for greater humility and ask God for help on our problem areas

SACRIFICIAL LOVE


- Jesus sacrificed all to save us from our sins (Phil. 2:5-11 again)
- Love your neighbor as yourself

OUR GOAL:

- Seek to see others as God sees them through God's grace
- Build relationships with others
- Be available to serve

KNOW THE SCRIPTURE

- Jesus knew the entire Scripture, quoted it frequently and spoke with great authority that regularly amazed His audiences
- On the Road to Emmaus--Luke 24:27:"Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures."



KNOW THE SCRIPTURES -continued

 At age 12, Jesus sat among the teachers in the temple and all who heard Him were amazed at His understanding and answers (Luke 2:27)

OUR GOAL:

- Read the Bible regularly and seek opportunities to study it
- Seek to memorize Scripture
- Pray for God's insights

RESIST SATAN

- Jesus resisted Satan's attacks in the desert at the beginning of His ministry by quoting Scripture three times (Matt.4:1-11)
 - After 40 full days of fasting
 - Satan tempts Jesus with bread, physical protection and political power if Jesus obeys satan's commands
 - The word of God prevails and satan is defeated

RESIST SATAN

OUR GOAL:

- Know Scripture
- Pray for God's power to resist Satan, to avoid sin and to keep God's word in our hearts
- Claim James 4:7 (resist and Satan will flee)

REACH OUT TO THOSE IN NEED

- Christ's message and miracles focused on those in need, spiritually and physically
- He cast out demons, healed the sick and disabled, forgave sins, brought the dead back to life, fed the hungry and otherwise met the needs of many, many people
- Luke 5:31--It is not the healthy who need a doctor

OUR GOAL IN REACHING OUT:

- Seek to actively identify those in need
- Seek God's guidance in how to help and His wisdom to act appropriately
- Be proactive in providing assistance
- No empty promises
- Be discreet

FORGIVENESS

- Jesus provided the way for our forgiveness through His suffering, death, and resurrection
- He also forgave the sins of many individuals
 - Those who killed Him --Luke 23:34 (Father forgive them...)
 - As he healed a paralytic --Matt.9:1-8 (take heart son your sins are forgiven...)
 - Simon Peter's forgiveness in John 21:15-19

FORGIVENESS-continued

OUR GOAL:

- Ask God for a forgiving heart where needed
- Confess our sins of withholding forgiveness

SPREADING GOD'S MESSAGE

 Jesus spread God's kingdom and message wherever He went-- open any page of the Gospels for examples

OUR GOAL;

- Pray for courage and wisdom
- Begin with careful preparation and study (know what to say)
- Always be ready

SERVANT LEADERSHIP

- Jesus redefined leadership in terms of service
- He washed the disciples' feet to emphasize that a leader must serve-- John 13:5-17
- Matt. 20:25-28 --whoever wants to lead must serve those he/she is leading, just as Jesus came to serve and die for our sins

SERVANT LEADERSHIP -continued

• OUR GOAL:

- To seek opportunities to serve
- To seek God's guidance
- To become more empathetic of others
- More on this in Part 3

LOVE YOUR NEIGHBORS (INVEST IN OTHERS)

- The second of the two greatest commandments---
 - Love your neighbor as yourself (Mark 12:28-31)
- The Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37)
 - A man traveled from Jerusalem to Jericho and was attacked by robbers, stripped, beaten and left for dead
 - A priest and a Levite separately came upon him but passed by on the other side without helping
 - A Samaritan also came upon the man

LOVE YOUR NEIGHBORS (INVEST IN OTHERS)

- The Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37)--continued
 - The Samaritan took pity on him, bandaged his wounds, put the man on his own donkey, took him to an inn, and took care of him
 - The next day the Samaritan advanced sums to the innkeeper for the man's continued care during the remainder of the Samaritan's journey and promised to pay for any shortfall



LOVE YOUR NEIGHBORS (INVEST IN OTHERS)

- What does the Parable of the Good Samaritan focus us on?
 - Who is your neighbor?
 - Love requires giving
 - Love directly involves us in the lives of others
- 1 John 4: If we love one another, God lives in us and His love is made complete in us

WHAT LOVING OUR NEIGHBOR MEANS

- Prioritize people over projects
- Build relationships (meals are good where feasible)
- Practice active listening
 - Where they are at emotionally and spiritually
 - What their true needs are
- Be proactive- don't wait to be approached

WHAT LOVING OUR NEIGHBOR MEANS-contd.

- No empty promises--follow up is essential
- Be discrete
- Recipients may react in varying ways
- You will become a changed person
- YOU will be greatly blessed

CHALLENGES IN LOVING OTHERS

- May require personal sacrifice
- This does not come naturally for some of us
- Focus a lot on one person v. Focus a little on many
- Teach self-sufficiency
- Coach others to duplicate your efforts
- Allow God to interrupt your schedule

REMEMBER...

- These are all lifelong goals
- Christ lived the perfect life
- We are all imperfect, even at our best
- Don't become discouraged and don't give up
- We all face daily challenges in each season of life
- We are all in this together
